## Personal, Emotional and Social Development

Talk about feelings: how did the mouse and other characters feel in the story?

Talk about their own food preferences when they had tasted different foods.

Carry out and take responsibility for different tasks when making cakes and biscuits.

## Physical Development

Draw pictures of the Gruffalo and friends Draw themselves in the forest with Gruffalo

Read the Gruffalo and other stories independently holding the book and turning pages
