#### Year 6

In science lessons this half term, class 14 have been looking at evolution and inheritance. We have been focusing on the idea of adaptation (this is how animals are adapted to survive in their habitats). We did an investigation looking at different types of beaks. We had to get the different types of food on offer e.g. marshmallows, peas, rubber bands, cocktail sticks and marbles into our stomachs (paper cups) using different types of beak. For the beaks we used: scissors, clothes pegs, tweezers and teaspoons. Overall, we learnt that not all types of beak are suitable for every type of food.
